

Exeter Pedestrian Safety

Ms FINLAY question to MINISTER for INFRASTRUCTURE and TRANSPORT

Many residents in Exeter have contacted me with serious and ongoing concerns about pedestrian safety. Community members, including parents, older residents and school-aged children, are telling me and our candidate for Rosevears, Ben Mckinnon, as recently as the Exeter Show on the weekend, that the proposed crossings feel unsafe and visibility is poor, especially at peak times.

This is a serious matter that has had years of concern in the community, minister Abetz. While the proposed new crossings have been flagged, the community is clear that they are not well placed, there are not enough and they do not adequately address the broader safety risks on this stretch of road. There are now also concerns in Legana about crossings that have been implemented that are extremely unsafe. People want practical, on-the-ground solutions, not box-ticking exercises. They want to be heard and understood. Minister, will you meet directly with me and members of the West Tamar community to listen and implement meaningful road safety measures for the community?
